Gilbert Clark

Some of our older plotheolders may have known Gilbert Clark who has sadly passed away. Gilbert started on his first Edinburgh plot in 1956 at Liberton Brae. He was moved to Midmar when the site closed and has been on the committees of both our Federation and Scottish Allotments (SAGS) for 40 years. He attended meetings throughout that time and was awarded an MBE for services to the allotment community in 2001. Gilbert finally decided to resign from the Federation committee last year aged 96.

If you would like to pay your respects, his funeral will be held on Friday 24th January at 2 pm at St Columba's by the Castle, Johnstone Terrace, Edinburgh.



Birds, Butterflies and Bees on Allotment Sites
