Bands for Beasties

At the end of October, into November, grease bands or glue bands can be used on fruit trees, especially apples, plums and pears. This prevents crawling insect pests, such as winter moths, climbing into the trees to lay their eggs in autumn, winter and spring. The emerging caterpillars are hungry hoards that damage young leaves and budding fruit.
